

## REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

## OF THE WINTER INTERNATIONAL TECHNICAL COMMISSION

A wonderful week of Universiade is over. A week with high level performances, with excellent tracks, with beautiful stadiums, experienced organizers and enthusiastic spectators.

When the Universiade was given to Strbske Pleso, Czechoslovakia, we knew that these Games would be very well organized and these places in the High and Low Tatras mountains are ideal for all our Wintersports and for all athletes and officials.

FISU was happy to give the Games to Czechoslovakia, to a country which supports Student-Sport since more than sixty years. Czechoslovakia is a country with a very old Wintersport-tradition. The roots of skiing in Middle-Europe are also going back to Czechoslovakia, to the Giant Mountains and to the Tatras. Since more than five decades our friends are organizing International Student-Championships. I'd like to mention :

In the region of Strbske Pleso, Poprad and Jasna World Championships in Jumping and Cross-country-Skiing, World Cup Final in Jumping and different World Cup and European Cup races, European Junior Championships in alpine skiing were organized. All these events give an ideal basis for organizing the Winter Universiade 1987.

Athletes and officials except those of figure skating had been lodged in Strbske Pleso, in different hotels and recreation homes. So everybody had the possibility to get into contact with each other and to develop the spirit of student sport, the spirit of friendship. These contacts are the difference between student sport events and other sport events. It was a very lucky decision of FISU to lodge everybody at the same place!

About the sport competitions of Alpine Skiing, Cross-country Skiing, Jumping, Icehockey and Figure Skating are separate commentaries below. But I would like to point out that since the visit of FISU in 1985 they had been done an excellent work to prepare the stadium and tracks. And when a few days before the games warm weather nearly melted the snow away for Alpine Skiing in Jasna, hundreds of people and students moved snow on the tracks in order to guarantee the races.
